




- Do they have wills or advance directives?



- 50% of caregivers to people with dementia die before the person they are caring for?
- For spousal caregivers, 63% die before their loved one

Part 2: Why Parents Turn On Us

You are their baby

- They KNOW they are getting older
- You are adding to their terror
- You have the power
- They want control back

- There are questions you must ask
- Some parents will have taken steps already
- Many have not and they will get nasty

Prepare for Objections



- Approach gently
- Retreat but return
- Have stories at the ready
- They got lucky this time
- Denial can be defused
- Bring in another grown-up

Know What to Ask!

With persistence, you should be able to move forward

- Have your questions prepared
- Select an APPROPRIATE attorney to see
- Set an appointment and GO!
- Don't wait! They may change their minds.
